

# Wildfire Risk Management Plan

Having a wildfire risk reduction and management plan is important. Wildfire occurrence is increasing in Aotearoa New Zealand, and managing the risks is key to minimising the impact to you, your assets and your neighbours.

## Access

Action	Notes	Due date
Create and maintain 4m x 4m vehicle access		
Display bridge weight limits, RAPID numbers		
Padlocked gates		
Consider 2 access ways or share with neighbours		

## Water supply

Action	Notes	Due date
Create or identify a water supply for fire suppression		
Ensure fire appliances can access water supply		

Create space for pumps within 7 metres of water supply	
Consider sharing water supply with neighbours	

## Identify risks

Action	Notes	Due date
<b>Reduce or manage fuel</b>		
Remove or minimise weeds within plantings		
Reduce thinning and logging slash		
Create a buffer between neighbouring crops, trees and rank grass		
Remove gorse, volatile weeds and scrub around the neighbourhood		
<b>Machinery use and maintenance</b>		
Do not use machinery in very high or extreme fire danger conditions		
Keep firefighting equipment on hand when using machinery		
Clean and maintain machinery regularly		
Attach a spark arrestor to machinery if appropriate		
<b>Local community</b>		
Risk from neighbouring properties		
Consider a neighbourhood early warning system
